## **INTERNATIONAL RESERVES MANAGEMENT: JUNE 2020**

At the end of June 2020, the composition of the **Investment Portfolio** was the following: 65 percent invested in securities, 32 percent in deposits and 3 percent in gold. Regarding their composition by asset class, a conservative risk profile was maintained with predominance of investments in the highest quality securities.

In June, there was an increase in investments with maturities greater than one year and a decrease with those with maturities between 0 and 3 months and an increase in investments with credit ratings AAA and a decrease with those with credit ratings A+/A/A-. The duration of the portfolio was 0.77 at the end of June, 0.06 greater with respect to the previous month.

## **ANNEX 1: GLOSSARY OF TERMS**

**Net International Position.**- Central Bank's Net International Position is the difference of assets and liabilities in foreign exchange, both internationally and with residents. These assets could be diversified by currencies and gold.

Investment Portfolio.- It is the set of international assets under internal management.
